CAS, division of the American Chemical Society, the world's authority for chemical information, provides the most comprehensive databases of disclosed research in chemistry and related sciences. CAS has served chemists and other scientists for more than 100 years, beginning with the first issue of *Chemical Abstracts*<sup>TM</sup> in 1907.

Scientists who build CAS databases require extensive knowledge of languages in addition to expertise in a chemistry-related science. Staff members collectively analyze literature published in more than 185 countries in any of 50 languages.

CAS resources include the following databases and services:

- The world's most authoritative collection of disclosed chemical substance information, the CAS REGISTRY<sup>SM</sup>, incorporating records for more than 52 million organic and inorganic substances and more than 61 million sequences. CAS REGISTRY is the source and authoritative collection of CAS Registry Number<sup>®</sup> identifiers, the recognized standard for identifying chemical substances.
- CAS' comprehensive CAplus<sup>SM</sup> database of scientific literature—the only database of its kind that integrates information for chemistry-related journal articles with patents; CAplus covers publications back to the nineteenth century, with more than 32 million bibliographic records.
- Patent records available with unsurpassed timeliness from 60 patent authorities: patent records meeting CAS selection criteria from 9 of the major patent offices are available online in CAplus within 2 days of the patents' issuance and are fully indexed by CAS scientists in fewer than 27 days from the date of issue.
- Search tools, including SciFinder<sup>®</sup>, the first choice for scientific research, and STN<sup>®</sup>, the premier collection of scientific databases. STN is operated by CAS in cooperation with FIZ Karlsruhe and is represented in Japan by JAICI.
